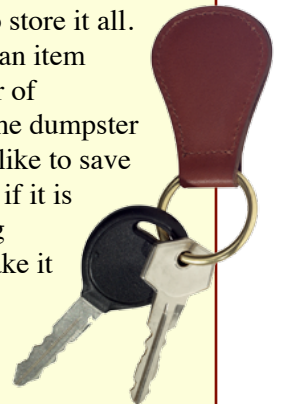
Clean Up Campaign
