


Yeti cooler

BATHROOM REMODEL ON TRACK TO FINISH FIRST OF OCTOBER

Scotty Jenkins, our building supervisor, reported at the last board meeting that because of help provided by our vice-president, Brad Storey, remodeling is on track to finish well before the opening of the Foreigner. It might be pointed out that not only is Scotty working 8 hours a day at the theater, he is also playing a major role in "The Foreigner".

A big boost in the construction came when Mena Steel Buildings agreed to cut the hole in the lobby wall for the hall to the new bathrooms. They provided two men for two days to do the work. Thank you!

As previously reported this work is possible through a grant from Western Arkansas Planning and Development, Inc. The leg work for this grant was done by Judy and Scotty. Judy provided the administrative expertise and Scotty the technical input. In addition to the \$15,000 awarded we were required to provide an other \$4500 in matching. Part of this could be "in-kind" labor. To that end we have already spent over 300 man hours which equates to over \$3000 in in-kind contributions. As part of the proposal the Guild was to contribute to the projects as well. With their cash contribution

and our labor we will easily meet the matching requirement.

All the sheet rock is up and taped. The plumbing is roughed in, and the electrical is 90% done. Materials for the walls and the floor are on hand.



If anyone would like to help us keep the cost down, we could use commercial grade toilet paper and towel dispensers, mirrors, and light fixtures. Jerry & Imelda and Joe & Ladonna have donated the grab bars for the ADA requirements
