The Buffalo River National Park Service is bringing *Still on the Hill*, one of Arkansas most beloved folk duos to Ouachita Little Theater in Mena on Sunday afternoon, November 19th (2:30). Still on the Hill will be performing their show, 'Still a River' celebrating our nation's first historic river in song. Even better, the concert is absolutely free and the first 100 attendees will receive a free copy of the 'Still a River' CD.

Still on the Hill is the duo of Donna and Kelly Mulhollan, recipients of the Arkansas Governor's Folk Life Award. They are modern-day bards, carrying on the ancient tradition of storytelling in song. This duo has often been called Ambassadors of the Ozarks for their decades of work preserving the stories of people and places in the hills they call home for over twenty years.

Kelly and Donna are consummate musicians and multi-instrumentalists. In all their shows they play a plethora of amazing instruments, many of which were created by Ozark instrument makers. Along with their core instruments such as banjo, fiddle, guitar and mandolin, you will hear oddities such as toy bells, a Hardanger fiddle built by Elliot Smith (who is 93 years old), a dulcimer built from a fiddle case, and even a musical saw.

The songs that make up 'Still a River' document little known stories of well-known landmarks along the Buffalo River. Bee Bluff, Sam's Throne, Tyler Bend, Granny Henderson's cabin, the zink mine at Rush Creek- these and more come to life in original songs written by *Still on the Hill*.

STILL A RIVER poignantly reminds us of what we cherish about our nation's *first* historic national river. It invites us, as the river's stewards, to protect the sights and sounds that nourish us.

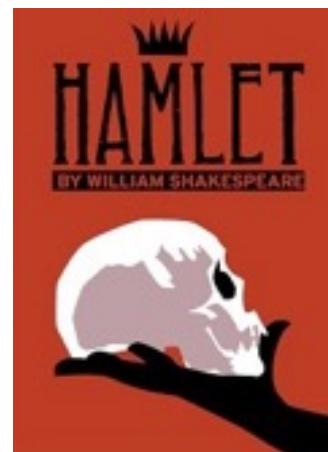


Shakespeare's Hamlet Wows Audiences

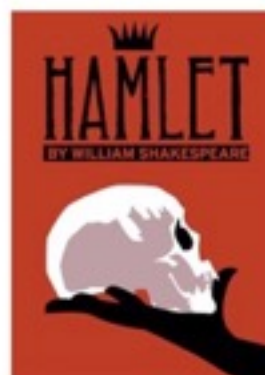

Ouachita Little Theatre is always looking for new ways to enhance the entertainment and leisure past-time activities of the local community. The newest venture is taking the form of the Memories Saver Service. This is a chance for patrons to convert their personal VHS tapes, old home movies, audio cassettes and more, to a new DVD format. There will also be copies of all previously recorded OLT plays and musicals to purchase, even of vintage performances from many years past. People who wish to make personal copies will be able to take advantage of this individualized service, done onsite at the Theatre Business Office, 610 Mena St. The greatest advantage for the consumer is the fact that materials will never leave the premises of the OLT office. Theatre officials promise they will be treated with great individual care and respect, especially old or delicate media. The OLT Board members desire to keep prices very reasonable; in most cases it will not cost more than \$20 to convert up to a 2-hour videotape to DVD. Costs will become even less as numbers of copies increase. No copyrighted materials may be copied, but anything of a personal nature will be allowed. To place your order, drop by the OLT office between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM on weekdays after September 18th. Any and all proceeds from this venture will go directly into the funds for the nonprofit organization of the Ouachita Little Theatre.

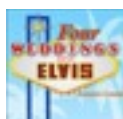

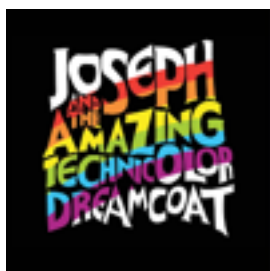
