This JOLT production, directed by Jackie Biard, will continue June 30, July 1, and July 6-8. Next the Just 4 Fun players take the spotlight with their production of *Harvey*. Tim Hesse, the director, will guide his charges through two dinner theatre performances at the Mena Mountain Resort Friday, July 20th and Saturday, 28th. Then the following weekend, August 3, 4, and 5 Harvey will play on stage at the OLT. The final show of the summer will be one written by our own Justin Richmond, Weeds and Dandelions. Justin is a member of our JOLT group. He wrote this play for a statewide competition and directed a performance of the show in Little Rock. He will bring it to the OLT stage near the end of August; tentatively August 17-19 and 24-27. Scotty Jenkins, AKA Rosco Splivins, will be the adult liaison.









Second Wednesday Free Movie nights will feature the Lyric Players.

The first of the summer free movies will be Field of Dreams. The lyric players will be on hand to open the show with their adaptation of the Abbot and Costello classic, "Who's on First" at 6:00 pm, Wednesday June 13. The movie will start at 6:30. other movies will be announced throughout the summer with each being introduced by an appropriate Lyric Players Readers Theatre presentation.



Teachers, teaching artists, and community arts participants are invited

to attend one-day trainings which focus on the potential collaborations between school arts programs and community arts organizations.

Participants will take away a series of instructional modules developed by the team of trainers. These modules will provide arts educators with rich resources that are specific to the artistic discipline they teach and aligned to the Arkansas Fine Arts Academic Standards.

Presenters: Patty Oeste (Conway Public Schools) and teaching artist Sheldon Harden (AAC Arts in Education) will create and utilize an 'escape room' as a formative or summative assessment related to the study of the elements of music.

Taking It to the Schools III:

Community Experiences in Theatre and Dance: Wednesday June 27 from 9 to 4 at OLT Presenters: Wyatt Hamilton (Bauxite Public Schools) and teaching artist Stephanie Thibeault (AAC Arts in Education and UALR) will lead participants in examining the difference between character and caricature, experimenting with related movement and dance, and tying the study of character into important discussions about diversity.

As a last chance before she is institutionalized, her parents contact a school for the blind, which sends half-blind Annie Sullivan to teach Helen. Helen is initially resistant, but Annie gradually forms a bond with her and shows Helen ways of reaching others.
