As disappointing as this bump in the road might be, we can't lose sight of the wonderful and successful shows we produced, starting with the musical Annie all the way through the OLT-UARM collaboration on A Midsummer Night's Dream. The 2019-2020 activity report also highlights our many other accomplishments. Furthermore, because of our community support we are also reporting that we are on a fiscally sound footing. The big question facing everyone right now is, "When can we get back to something resembling normal?" Last night at our board meeting the consensus was that we just don't know. We want adhere to the plan that the next show will be the musical BIG, but the production date is up in the air. As OLT supporters you should be aware that, like other small businesses as well as yourselves, we will be having some hard times until life gets back to normal after this pandemic. For example we have spent over \$3000 dollars on the royalties for "BIG" not to mention what "Little Women" will cost. Luckily MTI, the owners of the production rights, is working with us by letting us keep rehearsal materials as needed and also approving new performance dates. In addition close to \$2000 have been spent on the staging of "BIG". While much of this will be donated, OLT will have these and other expenses for the show. After having spent that money earlier with no refund possible, we are now faced with regular operating expenses without a substantial income. You can help by continuing to renew memberships and/or donation to OLT. We understand that this may not be possible for some, but if you can, please help.

MEMBERSHIPS

\$1000 GIFT-Major Donor- this includes 2 votes for e for the member and one for spouso/partner) and 2 season tickets. 18 complimentary tickets per year (2)

\$500 gift-Patron-includes 2 votes (one for their ember and one for spouss/partner) and 2 season flokets, 12 complimentary tickets (3)

\$250 gift-Supporter this includes 2 votes (one for the member and one for spouse/partner) and 2 season tickets, 6 compline entary tickets per year. (4)

\$125 gift is an Angel- this includes 2 votes (one for the member and one for spouse/pertner) and 2 season tickets. (5)

\$150 Commercial Member 2 votes (one for the member and one for spouse/partner), acc in program. TV, and website: 10 complimentary ficints (6)

\$25 Family Member-husband, wife and children, two votes (one for the member and one for spouse/partner)

\$10 OLT yearly memberno season tickets but a member and 1 vote, this includes the cost of insurance required by the insurance company for all participants in CLT programs and productions. All cast members and crew MUST be a member to participate in our productions.

Ufe membership is available for individuals only. It would be for a one-time gft of \$5000. This is non-transferrable membership that would give the member free admission to all OLT/JCLT functions, rame on TV and in program. They would have voting privileges for life. Complementary tickets would be available on request. This would be \$7500 for a couple.

Individual ticket prices are \$12 for an adult; \$8 for students \$ seriors for comedies and dramas.

Musical ticket prices are \$15 for adults; \$10.00 for students \$ seriors. Season tickets are good for up to 8 shows!
